## SHOOTING SPORTS DIRECTOR



General: Oversee the Shooting Sports Areas.

Responsible to: Program Director

## Specifics:

- 1. Oversee the Shooting Sports program. Ensure positive training for Scouts and adult leaders in the proper use of a rifle, shotgun, bow and arrow, range procedures, and safety rules are taught at the ranges.
- 2. Hold BSA Shooting Sports Director certification.
- 3. Insure that the shooting ranges meet established standards. Proper BSA standards for instruction, supervision and safety training are carried out in the marksmanship programs and that Range Staff are properly trained.
- 4. Maintain the range physical layout as given in the field sports manual of the Boy Scouts of America (including proper fencing, warning signs and warning flags) for each range.
- 5. Serve as a merit badge counselor of Shooting Sports merit badges.
- 6. Serve as a C.I.T. Mentor.
- 7. Be an enthusiastic key leader of the entire camp staff work closely with the Camp Director and other key leaders in providing positive leadership to the staff. Assist the Program Director in planning and implementing staff morale boosters.
- 8. Attend Area Directors meetings.
- 9. Responsible for opening and closing inventories of all Shooting Sports equipment.
- 10. Other duties as assigned by the Camp Director.
